የመርካቶ የገበያ ሥፍራ በኢትዮጵያ ሞና ከተማ አዲስ አበባ በሞንጃንት በአዲስ ከተማ ክፍለ ከተማ ደገኛል። መርካቶ በአጭራካ ትስቁ ገሳጣ ገበያ ነው። በብዙ ካሬ ኪሎ ሜትር በሚቆጠር መሬት ላይ ከ13,000 በላይ ሰዎችን ወደ 7,100 የሚደርሱ የንግድ ስራዎችን የያዘ ስንደሆን ደገመታል።

በዚህ የገበያ ሥፍራ ስብዛኛውን ጊዜ የሚዘወተሩት ሀገር በቀጠለ የሆኑ ምርቶች ሲሆኑ በሞንጃንት ቡና ስንደኛው ነው። ገበያው የተሞላው ዘረኛ በሆኑ የጣሊያን ገዥዎች ሲሆኑ ታሪካዊውን የቀዳሽ ጊዮርጊስ ስጦታዎችን ብቻ በመከሰስ ሞናዎችን የሰረብ ነጋዴዎች ወደ ምዕራብ ከግማሽ ማደል በላይ ርቀው ስንደነግዱ ስለገደደው ነበር። ቀስ በቀስ ስንደሆን የሰረብ ነጋዴዎች የሀገሪቱ ተወሳኝ በሆኑ ነጋዴዎች በመተካት ከ.አ.አ ከ1960 ዓ.ም ጀምሮ ሀገርን ያሰው ቃና ሲሆን ችሏል። በዚህ ሥፍራ የማይዘነጉት የሰንጠረዥ መስኪድ እና የራጉሴ ሴተ-ክርስቲያን ደገኛሉ።

ተማሪ ፌሲሞን፡- በምን ትምህርት መስክ ነበር የተመረቀሽው?

ወ/ሮ መኖ፡- የተማርኩት ኢንጅነሪንግ ነው። ስለሆነ ደግሞ ሁለተኛ ዲግሪዬን በንግድ ስራ አስተዳደር (Business Administration) እየያዝኩኝ ነው።

ተማሪ ስክሲዳ፡- ደህን ት/ቤት ስመክፈት ያነሳሳሽ ምንድነው?

ወ/ሮ መኖ፡- ደህን ት/ቤት ስመክፈት ያነሳሳኝ በወቅቱ ከዓፄ 18 ዓመት በፊት አስቀድሞ እንደተናገርኩት ወደ ማደንስና ሒሳብ ነክ ትምህርቶች ሳይ ትሰቀ የሆነ ዝንባሌ ነበረኝ። እኛ በወቅቱ ከተሰደዩ ት/ቤቶች የሚመጡ ሰጠኞችን ስመስክት ሒሳብ ነክ ነገር ሳይ በጣም ወደኋላ እንደቀረ ተመሰክትኩ። ስለዚህም ት/ቤት ብንከፍትና በሒሳብ፣ በሳይንስና በቋንቋ ትምህርቶች የዳበረ ትምህርት መስጠት ብንችል ብዙዎችን እናገዛለን ብለን በማሰብ እኔና ጌዳኛዬ ሠርካሽዲስ ሆነን ደህንን ት/ቤት መሰረትን።

ወ/ሮ መኖ፡- ፍሲጥር ት/ቤት ከመክፈቱ በፊት የሁለት ዓመት ዝግጅት ወስደብናል። በሁለቱ ዓመት ውስጥ ብዙ ጥናቶችን ስናካሂድ ነበር። ከተማ ውስጥ ያሉ ት/ቤቶችን ጠንካራና ደካማ ጎኖች ምን ደመሰሳሁ በማለት ጥናት አደረግን። ጠንካራ ነገሮችን ደዘን መክፈት ፈለግን፤ ምክንያቱም ት/ቤት መክፈት ማለት ቀላል ነገር አይደለም፤ ስብረተሰብ መቀረፅ ማለት ነው። ስለዚህ ስብረተሰብን ስንቀርፅ ደግሞ ስህገራችን ምን ዓይነት የሰው ሀይል ያስፈልጋታል፤ ምን ሳይ ጠንካራን ብንሰራ የተሻለ የሰው ሀይል ስህገራችን እንዲኖራት ማድረግ እንችላለን የሚሰውን በሙሉ አጥንተን ነው የክፍትነው።

ወ/ሮ መኖ፡- ት/ቤቱ ከተክፈተ ስሁን በምታዩት ደረጃ ማስተም እስከ ስድስተኛ ክፍል ባደረግንም የህፃናቶች ት/ቤት ከተክፈተ ስሁ ስምንት ዓመት ተቆጥሯል። ህፃናቶችን ሲያስተምር ስብዙ ጊዜ ቅዳታ። ወደ እንደኛ ደረጃ (እንደኛ፣ ሁለተኛ... ክፍል ማደግ የጀመረው ከዓፄ ስድስት ዓመት በፊት ነው።

ተማሪ በስምሳክ፡- ፍሲጥር ከመጀመሪያው እስከ ስሁን ድረስ ያሰውን ስኬታማነት ስታብራሩልን ትችሏለሁ?

ወ/ሮ መኖ፡- ፍሲጥር በጣም ስኬታማ ት/ቤት ነው ብለን እናምናለን። ከሁሉ በላይ እኛ ጋር የተማሪና ስየተማሪ ያሉ ተማሪዎች በብዙ ረገድ ማስተም በሒሳብ፣ በእንግሊዝኛ እና በአማርኛ ቋንቋ በሁሉም ደረጃ በጣም ጎበዞች ናቸው። በተጨማሪም ከብዙ ት/ቤቶች ጋር ሲወዳደሩ ጥንካፊዎቻችን ሰማየት ችለናል። ስለዚህ ደህ ትሰቀ ስኬታችን ነው። ሁለተኛው ስኬታችን ደግሞ ት/ቤታችን እንዲ የሚፈልገው አስተማሪ እና ተማሪዎች እንደ

ወ/ሮ መኖ:- ከተማሪዎች የምጠብቀው ነገር፣ በጥሩ ሥነ-ምግባርና በስውቀት ታንጠው እንዲያድጉ እፈልጋለሁ። ተማሪዎች መምህሮቻቸውን በተገቢ ሁኔታ እንዲያዳምጡና ወደተሻሻለ አቅጣጫ እንዲፈጠሩ እፈልጋለሁ፤ እጠብቃለሁ።

ተማሪ ሲሰራጩ:- እዚህ ግቢ ስምንተኛ ክፍል ይከፈታል?
